

THE MARCEL KROENLEIN ARBORETUM

Another look at the tree another idea of Art

Located in the Alpes-Maritimes between 1200 and 1700m, Roure's arboretum overlooks the valley of the Tinée, spanning 42 acres. It brings together trees of mountains all over the World. Characteristics: its collections of maples, old fruit trees, houseleeks, junipers, botanical roses and bird route.

It is labeled "Outstanding garden". This area owns one of the finest collections of conifers, hardwood... and artwork.

Roure's arboretum supports art and creations of the "no-made" Collective. Artists entrust their work to Nature that she sculpts in turn with the rain, wind, sun, snow... The exhibition is under the High Patronage of HSH Prince Albert II of Monaco, very sensitive to the bridge created between Science and Art.

Supervised by Dr Henri Sandoz and elite doctors of sciences, it ensures the site sustainability and the development of Mediterraneo-Alpine Institute of Biology and Ecology.

THE VILLAGE OF ROURE

Roure is a medieval village made of violet land; among its richness, we can see the baroque church, its Romanesque bell tower, the Chapel of St. Sebastian and its fresco called "vices" (1510). The remains of a watchtower from the 13th century; It is nowadays the "Great Watcher" of Nicolas Lavarenne, a bronze perched 6m high which welcomes visitors.
